NY Waterway to Provide Expanded, Cross-Honored Ferry Service During PATH Hoboken Station Closure, January 31 to February 24

Additional Ferry and Bus Service will be Offered Throughout 25-Day Closure Period

Passengers Must Purchase Special \$3 NY Waterway Fare Ticket on NYW App or at NYW Ticket Counters & Show PATH Fare Card Payment Mechanism at Boarding

Weehawken, NJ (January 28, 2025) – NY Waterway, which operates the largest ferry fleet between New Jersey and New York, is increasing its service and offering special discounted \$3 tickets to help PATH customers during the Hoboken PATH Station closure, from Friday, January 31 to Monday, February 24, 2025.

NY Waterway will provide expanded, cross-honored service during the closure period -- including additional peak service between Hoboken and Manhattan, extra crosstown bus service, extended operating hours at Hoboken terminals and an added weekend route -- during the planned February 2025 PATH Hoboken Station closure.

- Every PATH customer must have the special, discounted, one-way \$3 ticket to ride the ferry. The ticket is valid for Hoboken NJT Terminal & Hoboken 14th St. to all 3 Manhattan terminals (Midtown, Brookfield Place and Pier 11/Wall St.) for PATH customers.
- \$3 tickets can only be purchased on the NYW App and at NYW Ticket Counters (Not available at NYW Ticket Vending Machines (TVM) or onboard).
- At boarding, customers must show PATH fare card payment mechanism a SmartLink Card, MetroCard, PATH Single Ride Ticket or digital pass in the RidePATH app, plus the \$3 Special NYW Fare Ticket.
- No additional discounts apply to the \$3 Ferry Ticket. No refunds. Tickets expire February 24 (11:59pm).

Cross-honored ferry service:

- Additional peak period ferry service departing every 10 minutes from the PATH/NJ TRANSIT station ferry terminal to Midtown Terminal (West 39th St at 12th Ave).
- Expanded NY Waterway crosstown bus service from Midtown/West 39th Street terminal.
- Extended operating hours until 10 p.m. Monday- Thursday and 12 a.m. on Friday and Saturday at both Hoboken terminals.
- Additional weekend route, offering service to Midtown/West 39th Street from both Hoboken terminals.

"We're pleased to partner with PATH to provide continued, convenient service for commuters to and from Manhattan during this construction period," said **NY Waterway President and CEO Armand Pohan**. "We share a commitment to ensuring safe, reliable and pleasant travel experiences for all of our ferry passengers."

The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey has announced the PATH Hoboken station will be closed from 11:59 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 30, to 5 a.m. Tuesday, Feb. 25, as part of the agency's two-year \$430 million PATH Forward program.

About NY Waterway

Founded by Arthur Imperatore, Sr. in 1986, NY Waterway operates the nation's largest privately-owned commuter ferry service. Prior to the pandemic shutdown, NY Waterway carried more than 32,000 passengers each weekday on 23 routes across the Hudson River, bringing New Jersey commuters to Manhattan and back. In cooperation with MTA Metro North Railroad, ferries bring commuters from the west side of the Hudson River in Newburgh and Haverstraw to the Hudson Line stations in Beacon and Ossining.

On dozens of occasions, NY Waterway ferries have provided emergency service when public transit systems are disrupted. On 9/11, NY Waterway ferries evacuated more than 150,000 people from Manhattan, part of the largest maritime evacuation in history. In August 2003, when a massive blackout shut down all Hudson River crossings, NY Waterway carried 160,000 people home to New Jersey. Ferry crews also have rescued more than 300 people from New York waters, most notably the 143 people rescued from US Airways Flight 1549, the Miracle on the Hudson in 2009, the most successful marine rescue in aviation history.
